1.00pm Registration Opens // Glenrock State Conservation Area

Registration will be clearly set up at Gun Club Road entrance to the Glenrock State Conservation Area. Look for the Trailhead info board and we will be very close by.

Here, you'll receive your plates, transponder, event T-shirt and complimentary beer token for our welcome drinks later that night. You won't want to miss this function as we will also be running a lucky number plate draw to win one of ten sets of Maxxis tyres, supported by our friends at Lusty Industries. You have to be there to claim your prize, so make sure you join us for a great brew and your chance to win!

Access to the site is off the Pacific Highway. Limited parking is available, however a drop off area will be clearly marked and manned for ease of use. Additional parking is available on Scenic Drive and Fernleigh Loop which are a short ride to Registration and the start line.

3.00pm Prelude Starts // Glenrock State Conservation Area

Get into Newcastle early on Friday so you can be ready for the

Prelude that afternoon, a pulsating 9km loop in the renowned Glenrock State Conservation Area, less than a 10 minute drive from the town centre. Registration will be clearly set up at the Trailhead in our unmissable Quad Crown marquees.

If you haven't registered yet, here's where you'll receive your plates, transponder and event T-shirt. Parking is located on Mount Faulk Road at a generous private property owners' paddock before you come to the MTB Park turn off. Please follow the signs and marshal directions.

Stage 1 will traverse the foothills of the Watagans followed by a loop of Awaba MTB Park. Sounds pretty standard, right? WRONG. Be prepared for a course like you haven't seen before, a course where locals will be scratching their heads thinking "why does it feel like I've never been here before?". It will have punishing climbs, rugged moto single track, virgin forest trails, as well as Awaba essentials such as Polly Waffle, Skids for Kids, Tunnel of Love, Biraban AND Faulk Line!!!



An array of unique events make this pub one of the most exciting venues in the Hunter region.







HANDICAP SYSTEM

WEEKEND WARRIORS – HANDICAP SYSTEM

Our unique Quad Crown handicap system is one we have continued to revise across our first three events. We are now really confident that we have nailed it and our overall goal is achieved - to identify and crown the Weekend Warriors who ride to the best of their ability at each of our events.

This award is open to the whole field of riders (other than the Elites) and in essence you are riding the stages against yourself. much like a golfing handicap system works! Each rider will be given a handicap from the Prelude based on their own time versus the average time for all riders. So it is VERY IMPORTANT that you ride the Prelude if you want to be included in the race for the Warrior Crown!

The Prelude handicap will produce an expected time for Stage 1 which will be compared with your actual time. The rider who gets as close as possible to their expected time will be deemed the Stage winner.

The same will then happen for Stage 2, with your overall comparison times leading to a final placement on the Weekend Warrior Leaderboard. The aim is to identify the "most consistent rider" who can ride to the best of their own ability over each of the stages at The Black Pearl.

Keep an eye out for the Weekend Warrior Leaderboard after both Stages 1 and 2 as we will present stage winners for both male and female Warriors. At the conclusion of Sunday's Stage, we will award an overall Warrior King and Queen, which will be the riders in the field who raced closest to their handicap time over the two weekend stages. In the end this award is meant to be fun and create some banter amongst mates across various abilities to keep things interesting for all riders!

ELITE RIDERS – IN IT TO WIN IT!

We all know the elite riders are going to be up the front and smashing it like they do at every event. There will still be Leader jerseys for the leading male and female riders as well as podiums at the end to recognise the best of the best. And of course prize money! Furthermore, we have also implemented ranking points from each of the first three Quad Crown Series events. At the conclusion of the 2023 Series, an overall winner in the Elite Male and Female categories will be announced. Points have been allocated at each event. based on the Top 10 places in both the male and female elite categories. The overall 2023 Series winners will be awarded at The Black Pearl and the race is set to be a hot one!

JESS MANCHESTER

Jessica is a 23 year old kiwi currently living in Tasmania. Racing XCO for over 10 years now and has multiple National and Oceania Titles with 3 European seasons completed. Has goals to compete and get results internationally as an elite rider and get more women on bikes



KATHERINE HOSKING

Katherine isn't new to the mountain biking scene with multiple National Championships titles and plenty of international racing experience. She enjoys riding all bikes and believes the most important things are to always try new things and to always have fun!



ELLA MENIGOZ

Ella, a 17-year-old Brisbane local, has recently graduated and is excited to begin her engineering studies at the University of Queensland in the coming year. She proudly holds the title of U19 XCM National Champion, and her aspirations stretch even further, with her sights set on making her international debut in 2024.



RUBY DOBSON

At 18 years old she's the junior taking it to the Elite riders. With a handful of junior National Titles under her belt she's proven she has the talent, and at The Orca she was challenging for the stages early in the day. If she can find the endurance in those young legs, she'll be a contender for a stage win.





ELITE RIDER PROFILES

BRENT REES

Brent says "My path into racing MTB's was slightly different to most of my peers with a relatively late introduction. I made the transition from a Motocross background after I left school and fell in love with the adventure and experiences of travelling and pushing myself physically to new levels of fitness. I've fortunately had some great successes in



the past 5 years amongst my incredible travels throughout Aus, NZ, Asia and Europe. Including Stage wins at the Cape to Cape, Volcanic Epic, Multiple National XCO round Wins & podium, Multiple XCO state titles and most recently securing my first National title in the Marathon Champs in Wagga."

DAN MCCONNELL

Dan began cycling at 13 years of age and at 23 was chosen for the Australian Team where he made his Olympic debut at the 2008 Beijing Games. McConnell and followed that up with a spot at the 2012 Summer Olympics. At the 2014 Commonwealth Games, he won the bronze medal in the men's cross-country cycling.



CAM IVORY

Cam grew up riding his BMX bike in the bush behind his house and spent most school holidays digging jumps and trying to out-do his mates.



After a bad crash where he knocked out his front teeth and got stitches in his lip, he gave

mountain biking a go at age 14 and quickly started to progress through the club grades, state and national level until he got selected for the 2009 Junior MTB World Championships at Mt Stromlo.

Since then, Cam has been a member of the Australian MTB team most years and was a member of the 2014 Commonwealth Games team racing in Glasgow, Scotland. He is a 3 x National Champion Winner and definitely one to watch at The Black Pearl.



CATEGORIES & AWARDS

The Black Pearl is less about prize money and more about good times and an epic three days of riding. However, we do wish to acknowledge the riders who perform to the best of their ability and cross the finish line in the best time.

Our handicap system ensures that everyone and anyone is in the mix to be crowned the overall winner of The Black Pearl (Male and Female) and proclaimed King and Queen. Podium glory, prizing and a taste of royalty await the Male and Female who finish with the fastest adjusted time.

We've been monitoring our handicap system closely over the previous three events and think we've hit on the winning formula. However, we're always looking at ways to improve our events for ALL our riders and we've got one small change for The Black Pearl. After the Prelude, we will present a pink and yellow jersey to the overall leaders of the whole field. After Stages 1 and 2, there will be presentations to the Top 3 eBikes, Elites and Warriors. By blending the Open and Masters categories together under the Warrior Crown, we really are acknowledging the Quad Crown King and Queen!

Of course, you can still check your results under these categories (Open, Masters, Super Masters, eBikes and Elite) to see how you performed.

IMPORTANT RIDE INFORMATION

RIDER REGISTRATION

All riders are required to collect their rider pack prior to the event. This pack will contain your number plate, transponder and cable ties and an event t-shirt.

Rider pack collection will be open at Registration each day of the event - Glenrock MTB Park on Friday November 10 from 1.00pm, 8.00am at Awaba MTB Park Trailhead on Saturday November 11 and again from 8.00am at the Royal Crown Hotel on Sunday November 12. It is highly recommended that riders collect packs on Friday so that your bike is setup correctly in advance and to avoid time delays.



TIMING

The Black Pearl is timed electronically by OneTime. You will receive a number plate, transponder and cable ties in your rider pack. These need to be fixed to your bike for the duration of the event. Please affix your transponder as per the below image. You cannot change transponders with another rider as it is unique to your registration. The Transponders must be handed back at the finish line of your final day of riding. You may keep your plate as a souvenir.

If you have a timing issue, please have a chat with our staff at the Race HQ tent.





IMPORTANT RIDE INFORMATION

ACCIDENTS ON COURSE

If a rider in front of you crashes, this is not an opportunity to pass! Please stop immediately and ask if they need assistance. The first rider on the scene should remain with the rider, if the rider requires medical assistance the second rider on the scene is to remember the rider number and move forward to the next marshal check point with a radio. This will allow for medical assistance to be called and first aid to respond.

RIDER ETIQUETTE

Riders are to be reported to the Event Director if they:

- Disobey road rules;
- Be rude or disrespectful to other riders or marshals;
- Who behave in a way that puts any rider or marshal in danger;
- Is reported to litter on course;

Quad Crown believes in the honest and supportive culture of Mountain Biking and holds the safety of our riders a priority. If you stop to assist a rider with a mechanical or injury, please report to HQ and you will be awarded a time credit for the time spent helping out a fellow rider.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Whilst there is a portion of the course that is managed by our Traffic Controllers, the majority of it will have live traffic, meaning road rules will apply. Riders must NOT ride in a bunch on the road or take over the lane. It is important to understand that while traffic management is in place, roads remain open to vehicles. Riders must always give way to cars.

Riders who have medical conditions (eg Asthma) must carry their own medication for the duration of the event.

All riders should carry enough food, water, basic first aid and a tool kit in their daily ride kit. There will be basic feed stations on the course to allow riders to adequately rest and refuel.

WITHDRAWING FROM THE RIDE

Should a rider decide to withdraw from the ride, they must notify official marshals on course, who will then communicate to the SAG vehicle to come and pick up the rider or alert timing so we're not waiting for you to finish while you're chilling at the after party!



IMPORTANT RIDE INFORMATION

START LINE - PRELUDE

The Prelude will see riders move through the course one by one with a gap between riders to ensure a clear run. There are overtaking points along the course should you need them and be sure to let a rider overtake should this happen to you.

At the conclusion of the Prelude the results and wave start times for the following Stage will be announced at Modus Brewing welcome function and posted on social media. If you can't make the prelude and have registered for the weekend ride, don't stress – you will be given an average time for your seeding. Ebike riders will start at the last wave for all Stages.

START LINE - STAGES 1 & 2

Riders will be called into the Start grids based on their predetermined start times announced the day prior. You will be checked off as you enter the grid, and your transponder will be already programmed to a gun start time. Elite riders will start first and then riders will self-seed from fastest to slowest.

If you wish to change waves to ride with a mate or you are running late, please let the timing tent know so we can make sure you get an accurate result. You're always welcome to hang back wave to ride with your mates, however we cannot push riders forward a wave.



EXPLANATION OF SERVICES

Bag Drop	The Black Pearl has limited storage available, however the team at Information will gladly hold a bag, jumper or belongings while you ride.
Bike Mechanic	TREK will be on site each day looking after your bike servicing needs.
Bottle Drop	The Quad Crown will have a bottle Drop service on Saturday and Sunday of the race. Please ensure your bottle is dropped in the crates at Information prior to 8.30am and it will be taken to the water point for you. Please be advised that riders will not be able to collect their bottles until Saturday morning at the start line for Stage 1 and then at the presentations for Stage 2 as we wait for the Tail End to bring these back.
Coffee	Very important! Saturday and Sunday will see Oneill's Mobile Coffee on site to ensure you are caffeinated before the ride!
Information tent	Got a question? Be sure to see a friendly Quad Crown team member at the information tent who will have all your answers. Day 1 will see information services open at 1.00pm. Days 2 and 3 at 8.00am. You can also purchase your exclusive Quad Crown rider jersey here.
Parking	Prelude: Limited parking is available at Gun Club Road, however we will have a drop -off service available. We advise parking along Fernleigh Loop and Scenic Drive. Stage One: Parking is located on Mount Faulk Road at a generous private property owners' paddock before you come to the MTB Park turn off. Please follow the signs and marshal directions. Stage Two: Parking is available at the sports oval on Pitt Street, directly across the road from the Royal Crown Hotel.
Registration tent	Registration tent will be open from 1.00pm till 4.00pm on Friday November 10 at Glenrock State Conservation Area Trailhead, 8.00am on Saturday November 11 at Awaba MTB Park Trailhead and Sunday November 12 at the Royal Crown Hotel.
Rider packs	Rider packs will be available for collection at the registration tent. Your pack will include your transponder and rider plate, and event t-shirt.
Water Points	Water points are located at approximately the halfway point of each stage for both Stages 1 and 2. There is no water point for the Prelude. We strongly advise you carry enough water for the course however we'll be there if you need us.
